Top air sport athletes from around the globe will travel to Dubai, UAE, to compete in the largest air sports event in the world...the FAI World Air Games. Over a period of 12 days, spectators will enjoy special locations while watching world class competitions and air shows fill the sky in a dazzling display of manoeuvres that can only take place above the ground.

Airplanes and gliders amaze the crowd with spins, loops, and dives. Powered planes show their skills in an air navigation race. People look up to see colorful hot air balloons and airships dotting the sky. Hang gliders compete for aerobatic ability, while paragliders show off their aerobatic and landing accuracy abilities. Parachutists work together in incredible formations and last, but not least, microlights and paramotors compete in slalom races as helicopter pilots show off their craft in slalom and accuracy competitions. This year's theme is "World Air Games". Artwork is judged, at least in part, for its creative use of this year's theme in relation to the aviation world.

deadline

Entries must be sent to your state's sponsor office (see return address on this brochure or go to: www.nasao.org) and must be postmarked by **Friday, January 23, 2015**.

eligibility

All children in the age groups shown below are encouraged to participate in the contest, even if they are related to officials or employees of the FAI or any of its member organizations.

age groups

- Group I** **Junior Category**
Born between Jan 1, 2005 and Dec 31, 2008
- Group II** **Intermediate Category**
Born between Jan 1, 2001 and Dec 31, 2004
- Group III** **Senior Category**
Born between Jan 1, 1997 and Dec 31, 2000

state awards

Entries in each age group are judged and state winners and runners-up are selected. Winners receive a certificate and recognition from their state. The top three entries in each age group are forwarded to Washington, D.C. to be judged in the national competition.

national awards

1st, 2nd and 3rd place national winners are selected from each age group. All national winners receive certificates, ribbons and a framed reproduction of their artwork.

international awards

The 1st, 2nd and 3rd place national winners in each age group are forwarded to FAI Headquarters for international judging. Winners of the international competition receive certificates and gold, silver or bronze medals.

Calling all Montana students!!! The MDT Aeronautics is inviting all Montana students to participate in the 2015 Aviation Awareness Art Contest. MDT Aeronautics feels it is important to educate students of all ages in the many career opportunities in the field of aviation and aerospace. This contest gives students the chance to really explore this country's history surrounding aviation and how it has affected our economy today. By broadening their knowledge of this field, it is our hope that students will gain a new found interest in aviation/aerospace and it's increasingly evolving career opportunities.

Winners of the State Aviation Awareness Art Contest will go on to compete in a National Aviation Art Contest hosted by the National Association of State Aviation Officials (NASAO). However, in order to qualify for the National Art Contest, there are several guidelines that must be followed:

1. Theme: "World Air Games Dubai." – see brochure for more details.
2. Must be born between the dates: January 1, 1997 – December 31, 2008.
3. Format: A3 or 11 ¾" x 16 ½" or nearest possible equivalent.
4. Artwork must not be framed or outlined with borders.
5. All artwork must be done by hand (or, in the case of physically challenged children, by foot or mouth). Any of the following media are permitted: watercolor, acrylic, oil paint, indelible marker pens, felt-tip pens, soft ball point pens, indelible ink, Crayola or any similar indelible medium. The following media are **NOT permitted**: pencil, charcoal or other non-permanent medium; computer-generated artwork; collage work involving the use of photocopies.
6. The following information should be clearly shown on the back of the artwork: **title, family name, given name, address, date of birth, country of residence, name and address of school which the child attends, and certificate of authenticity (included in the Brochure).**
7. Once received, entries become (and remain) the property of the State Sponsor and may be used for a variety of purposes. Those forwarded for international judging become (and remain) the property of the Fédération Aéronautique Internationale (FAI).

Students are by no means required to adhere to the guidelines above for the MDT Aviation Awareness Art Contest. The guidelines are only for those students who wish to participate in the National Art Contest sponsored by NASAO. A brochure has been included to further explain the NASAO Contest and all entries must be sent to the MDT Aeronautics Division.

FIRST, SECOND and THIRD place awards will be presented to the top aviation posters entered in each of the following Groups:

Group I Junior Category (Date of birth between January 1, 2005 and December 31, 2008)

Group II Intermediate Category (Date of birth between January 1, 2001 and December 31, 2004)

Group III Senior Category (Date of birth between January 1, 1997 and December 31, 2000)

FIRST PLACE PRIZES in each group:

1. An MDT Representative will mail a 1st Place Congratulatory Letter to the student to notify them.
2. A round trip flight from the winner's hometown to Helena for the winner and his/her parents (legal guardians) if the weather permits.
3. A tour of the Montana Capital Building and lunch in Helena.
4. A trophy and Certificate of Achievement presented by an MDT representative.
5. Artwork will be matted and framed and returned to you at the Capital Building.



SECOND AND THIRD PLACE in each group:

1. A trophy and Certificate of Achievement.

Important Information:

1. Contest Deadline: ALL entries must be postmarked by **Friday, January 2, 2015**
2. Size of poster is not to exceed 11" x 14".
3. Artwork must have an aviation theme (to qualify Nationally, Theme must be World Air Games Dubai)
4. Please no tracing the images.
5. The following information should be clearly shown on the back of the artwork: title, family name, given name, address, date of birth, country of residence, name and address of school which the child attends.

Winners will be contacted by an MDT Aeronautics representative after the contest deadline. Arrangements can be made at that time for air travel to Helena. An article announcing the winners of the 2015 Aviation Awareness Art Contest will be published in the MDT Aeronautics Division monthly newsletter, *Montana and the Sky*. A complimentary copy of *Montana and the Sky* is sent to all school libraries and mailed to registered pilots across Montana.

Winners will also receive a complimentary copy.
