CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. by Board Chair Erik Yager.

Board Chair Erik Yager explained the public comment process to be followed for addressing the Board in accordance with Gallatin Gateway School Policy #1441. He stated that prior to a vote the public may comment on agenda items. There will be time for public comment on non-agenda items. Public comment periods are not intended to be a question and answer session and may not include discussions of performance, evaluations or anything that may infringe on any person's right to privacy.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Deb Clark noted that the teaching staff would be available to discuss grade placement next year with the Board and explained that combining classes is not the best option, but if it had to be done it would be preferable to have a 2nd/3rd grade combination than a 1st/2nd combination class. She stated that if there was a combination class next year it would be her recommendation that it be all day and a full-time aide assigned to the classroom.

GUESTS

Mrs. Abbey Steffl presented the Smokey the Bear / Woodsy Owl fourth grade poster contest winners to the Board. Miles Zitzer received 1st place, Emily Rabel received 2nd place and Leeza Dubois received 3rd place for entries into the poster contest.

The Board recognized Adam Rabel with a \$60 gift certificate and thanked him for plowing the snow in the parking lot during the winter months.

The Board presented Mrs. Abbey Steffl, teacher and Mrs. Ann Prescott, Willow Bend Farms, with student signed photos for their participation and implementation of the Junior Achievement program at Gallatin Gateway School. Mrs. Steffl explained to the Board how the Junior Achievement program helped tie her curriculum together. She stated, "I couldn't have imagined a better last five Friday's of class to tie everything together."

The Board will also be presenting student signed photos to Mr. Vollmer, teacher and Mr. Scott Meyers, Rocky Mountain Choppers, for 5th grade Junior Achievement at the completion of their five lessons in June.

A Junior Achievement plaque will hang in the lobby of the school recognizing community volunteers Ann Prescott and Scott Meyers for their contributions to the 4th and 5th grade curriculum by using Junior Achievement lessons. 4th and 5th grade students each year will receive Junior Achievement lessons thanks to a start-up donation this year. This program will continue to integrate economics education with the current social studies curriculum in both fourth and fifth grades.

The Board recognized three middle school students for their 2006 Declamation projects. Graham Foster was awarded 3rd place in the written competition, Kalena Paea was awarded 3rd place for her oral presentation, and Kasey Thiem received 1st place in the written competition for her entry. The Declamation is a Gallatin County writing and speaking competition supported by the Gallatin County Superintendent's office and the Gallatin County Bar Association for rural middle school students.

A motion was made by Trustee Alec Nisbet to approve the minutes for the May 2, 2006 special meeting. Trustee Cheryl Thiem seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Thiem, Yager and Zinner. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

RECOGNITION OF TRUSTEE ZINNER

The Board recognized the service of Trustee Zinner. Board Chair Erik Yager noted that Trustee Zinner has spent extra time educating herself to the duties of Board members and then thanked her for the extra personal time she gave "behind the scenes" during her three-year term on the Board. County Superintendent Mary Ellen Fitzgerald stated that Trustee Zinner had a deep commitment to the Board and to Gallatin Gateway School and commented that it had been a pleasure to watch Trustee Zinner grow as a trustee during her term. County Superintendent Fitzgerald thanked Trustee Zinner "for a job very well done."

SWEAR IN TRUSTEE

Board Chair Erik Yager introduced County Superintendent Mary Ellen Fitzgerald who then swore in Erik Yager and Nikki Robbins as the newly elected Board Trustees.

REORGANIZATION OF THE BOARD

A motion was made by Trustee Jess Holloway to appoint Erik Yager as Board Chair. The motion was seconded by Trustee Cheryl Thiem. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Trustee Cheryl Thiem to appoint Jess Holloway as Board Vice Chair. The motion was seconded by Trustee Alec Nisbet. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Trustee Cheryl Thiem to appoint Carrie Fisher as District Clerk. The motion was seconded by Board Chair Erik Yager. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

FINANCE

A motion was made by Vice Chair Jess Holloway to approve warrants (#25808-#25969- Void-none). The motion was seconded by Trustee Cheryl Thiem. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

The food service reports for February and March were presented to the Board by Ms. DeBruycker.

The Board reviewed the history of meal costs for the food service program and discussed the options available to keep the cost of lunch affordable for students and staff.

Trustee Cheryl Thiem made a motion to approve \$1.25 for student and adult breakfasts effective for the 2006-2007 school year. Trustee Nikki Robbins seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Vice Chair Jess Holloway made a motion to approve \$2.00 for student lunches effective for the 2006-2007 school year. Board Chair Erik Yager seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Robbins, and Yager. Opposed: Nisbet and Thiem. Motion passed 3-2.

Trustee Alec Nisbet made a motion to approve \$2.50 for adult lunches effective for the 2006-2007 school year and to not allow ala-cart options for adults. Vice Chair Jess Holloway seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment: Tom Vanderbeck stated that the increase in fuel costs could have an impact on the rise in food costs. Board Chair Erik Yager explained that food costs have been going up across the board and the Co-op membership has been a great benefit to the school meal program. Board Chair Yager continued by stating that there have been increases in utility costs and food costs, making it a balancing act between the food service fund and the general fund. Mike Coon asked when the last increase in meal costs had been approved. Scott Vollmer stated that the food program is a good value for what you pay and many of the students are eating more than \$1.85 worth of food.

Trustee Cheryl Thiem made a motion to approve Cheryl Thiem, Erik Yager, Helen Zinner and Elizabeth Kaleva as members of the negotiations team representing the Board. Trustee Alec Nisbet seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment: Trustee Nikki Robbins stated that she would be interested in stepping-in on behalf of the Board if in the future Helen was unable to continue on the committee. Trustee Cheryl Thiem stated that Helen Zinner has experience on the committee and encouraged her to stay. Susan DeVries noted that she felt Helen Zinner has had a really hard time meeting and encouraged the Board to see if Trustee Robbins would have a more open schedule to accommodate the frequent meetings.

The Board reviewed signed minutes from the January 16, 2006 negotiations committee meeting and draft minutes from the April 24, 2006 committee meeting.

Trustee Alec Nisbet made a motion to approve the signed minutes from the January 16, 2006 Negotiations committee meeting. Trustee Cheryl Thiem seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Trustee Nikki Robbins seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment: Tom Vanderbeck stated “Go for it.” Trustee Alec Nisbet thanked all of the teachers present for their service at Gallatin Gateway School.

Trustee Alec Nisbet made a motion to adopt revisions to GGS Policy #5430- Volunteers. Vice Chair Jess Holloway seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Trustee Alec Nisbet made a motion to adopt new GGS Policy #5430P- Volunteers with the addition of Miss and Ms. to item #1 in the list. Vice Chair Jess Holloway seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Trustee Cheryl Thiem made a motion to adopt new GGS Policy #5430F- Chaperone Guidelines. Trustee Alec Nisbet seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Trustee Nikki Robbins made a motion to adopt new GGS Policy #5430F2- Volunteer Guidelines. Trustee Cheryl Thiem seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

PERSONNEL

A motion was made by Vice Chair Jess Holloway to approve hire Joanne Heusel for the 2006-2007 school year with a .625 certified FTE for 117 days and .375 secretary at \$11.00/hour for 63 days. The motion was seconded by Trustee Nikki Robbins. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment: Kristin Horgan asked if the .625 FTE was the teacher the Board intended to hire with the passage of the mill levy. Susan DeVries asked how many applications were received for this position. Trustee

Alec Nisbet stated that he had concerns about hiring a secretary when there is a need for a middle school teacher. Board Chair Erik Yager stated that based on the number of kindergartners registered and the information the Board currently has available, a kindergarten teacher needs to be hired for next year. Trustee Nikki Robbins stated that she was initially hesitant to hire a new teacher without knowing who teaches what and where next year, but feels okay now with hiring a new teacher for kindergarten.

A motion was made by Vice Chair Jess Holloway to approve hire Joanne Heusel for the summer as an office/title assistant with a maximum of 25 hours a week at \$10.00/hour. The motion was seconded by Trustee Nikki Robbins. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment: Tom Vanderbeck asked if having extra help in the office would take any of the work load from the current clerk.

Board Chair Erik Yager called for a recess at 8:20 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:25 pm.

OLD BUSINESS

Trustee Alec Nisbet made a motion to set the 2006-2007 Kitchen Manager wages at \$11.30/hour for a maximum of 30 hours a week for 180 days and a \$500 year-end bonus for a full year of service and an inventory of \$500 or less. Trustee Cheryl Thiem seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment: Mike Coon asked when the Board had last approved a wage increase for the Kitchen Manager. He continued by stating that the increase in lunch costs should help offset the increase in hourly wages.

Vice Chair Jess Holloway made a motion to set the 2006-2007 Kitchen Assistant wages at \$8.50/hour for a maximum of 20 hours a week for 180 days. Motion was not seconded. Motion fails.

Trustee Cheryl Thiem made a motion to set the 2006-2007 Kitchen Assistant wages at \$8.00/hour for a maximum of 20 hours a week for 180 days. Motion was not seconded. Motion fails.

Trustee Alec Nisbet made a motion to set the 2006-2007 Kitchen Assistant wages at \$8.25/hour for a maximum of 20 hours a week for 180 days. Trustee Nikki Robbins seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Trustee Alec Nisbet made a motion to set the 2006-2007 District Clerk wages at \$13.50/hour for a maximum of 40 hours a week year round and disregard the out-of-district tuition for the District Clerk's two children. Trustee Cheryl Thiem seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment: Susan DeVries asked if the Clerk is compensated for the extra time put in beyond the approved 40 hours/week. Board Chair Erik Yager stated that he would like to readdress the District Clerk wages at the next meeting and asked the Superintendent to present some creative options for compensation.

Vice Chair Jess Holloway made a motion to set the 2006-2007 Business Manager wages at \$15.45/hour for a maximum of 16 hours a week year round. Trustee Alec Nisbet seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Vice Chair Jess Holloway made a motion to set the 2006-2007 Classroom Aide wages at \$10.00/hour for a maximum of 40 hours a week for 180 days. Trustee Alec Nisbet seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Trustee Nikki Robbins made a motion to set the 2006-2007 Network Administrator wages at \$11.85/hour for a maximum of 20 hours a week year round. Board Chair Erik Yager seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Trustee Cheryl Thiem made a motion to set the 2006-2007 Bus Driver wages at \$10.75/hour for a maximum of 4 hours a day for 180 days. Trustee Alec Nisbet seconded the motion. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment: Scott Vollmer stated that it would be hard for the school to find someone as good as the current bus driver. Mike Coon agreed and stated that the current bus driver takes a genuine interest in the students and the betterment of the school. Susan DeVries commented "If you can afford it do it."

NEW BUSINESS

ACADEMICS

Superintendent Kim DeBruycker presented proposed corrections/revisions to the Board because the calendar was marked incorrectly for the end of the Quarter in January and March.

A motion was made by Trustee Cheryl Thiem to approve the corrections/revisions to the 2006-2007 School Calendar. The motion was seconded by Vice Chair Jess Holloway. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: Robbins. Motion passed 4-1.

Public Comment: Deb Clark stated that it was not intentional on her part to agree to only one PIR day prior to the beginning of the year. Susan DeVries stated that having two PIR days before school starts is important for teachers that work during the summer months and need more time to set up their classrooms. Renae Myers stated that there was a PIR day added in February and recommended the Board move that PIR day back to ensure there are two PIR days before school starts. Susan DeVries asked who makes the calendar and how it is approved.

A motion was made by Trustee Alec Nisbet to adopt the proposed 2006-2007 Kindergarten School Calendar. The motion was seconded by Vice Chair Jess Holloway. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment: Suzanne Marshall stated that the 2005-2006 kindergarten calendar worked well and stated that Mrs. Myers did a wonderful job adapting to the schedule. Kristin Horgan encouraged the Board to make kindergarten five days/week.

A motion was made by Trustee Alec Nisbet to adopt new GGS Policy #3122P2- Part-Time Attendance. The motion was seconded by Vice Chair Jess Holloway. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Public Comment: Scott Vollmer explained that he had never dealt with part-time attendance prior to working at Gallatin Gateway School and initially thought that the more the merrier. He continued by asking why Gallatin Gateway School was good enough for homeschool students to attend half-day and stated that he would love to have homeschool students for a full-day. Trustee Alec Nisbet stated that he liked GGS Policy #3122P2 because it was black and white. Trustee Nikki Robbins expressed concern about part-time students being eliminated from participating the school lunch program and recess. Scott Vollmer commented on the unstructured time of lunch and recess and also noted that the school's adequate yearly progress is measured by the tests of all students- full-time and part-time. He noted that the school is held accountable to test results for subjects that teachers don't teach to the part-time students.

A motion was made by Trustee Alec Nisbet to adopt new GGS Policy #3122F- Part-Time Attendance Contract. The motion was seconded by Vice Chair Jess Holloway. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

Board Chair Erik Yager presented and reviewed the 2006 student survey results with the Board. Board Chair Yager stated that the positive outcome of the survey results is a testament to the new elective classes in the middle school, the administration and the middle school teachers. He continued by noting that he was disappointed and concerned with the increased poor responses to the question "I am challenged by the work my teacher asks me to do." Board Chair Yager explained that in his opinion the responses to the question are society's failure to have expectations and noted that students completing worksheet after worksheet at Gallatin Gateway is a concern.

A motion was made by Vice Chair Jess Holloway to adopt revisions to GGS Policy #3226- Hazing/Harassment/Intimidation/Bullying/Menacing. The motion was seconded by Trustee Cheryl Thiem. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Vice Chair Jess Holloway to adopt the 2006-2009 Technology Plan. The motion was seconded by Trustee Nikki Robbins. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Trustee Alec Nisbet to adopt new GGS Policy #2510- School Wellness. The motion was seconded by Trustee Cheryl Thiem. For: Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: Holloway. Motion passed 4-1.

A motion was made by Trustee Alec Nisbet to adopt the Wellness Procedure on Physical Activity and Nutrition. The motion was seconded by Trustee Cheryl Thiem. For: Holloway, Nisbet, Robbins, Thiem, and Yager. Opposed: none. Motion passed unanimously.
