Voter registration cards may be downloaded at: http://sos.mt.gov/elections/officials/forms/documents/Voter-Registration-Application.pdf

To vote in the Gallatin Gateway School District, one must be:


- 1. 18 years of age on or before Election Day.
- 2. Be a registered voter no less than 30 calendar days before election.
- 3. Be a U.S. citizen.
- 4. Reside in the Gallatin Gateway School District.

The deadline for regular registration for the school election was **Monday**, **April 4, 2016**. If a voter missed the regular registration deadline, he/she may still register for the election by showing up at the county election office up to and including on Election Day. Citizens may register to vote by completing a voter registration card and returning it to: Election Administrator, 311 West Main, Room 210, Bozeman, MT 59715.

Gallatin Gateway School District #35 will hold its annual school election by mail ballot. Voters will decide on two open Trustee seats and a requested General Fund Levy. This brochure explains the details of each issue on the ballot.

Requested General Fund Operating Levies

The Gallatin Gateway Board of Trustees is requesting a General Fund operating levy increase of \$25,389.87 for next year. The primary reason for requesting this levy is a continuing drop in enrollment, leaving the school with only an additional \$9,841.29 next year to support current student programs, staff, and maintenance of our aging facility. One of the strategic goals of the Gallatin Gateway School Board is to "provide and maintain high quality educational services." The Board has determined that costs for operation and maintenance as well as increases in providing our current instructional program will require an additional \$35,000 over last year's budget.
