 - O Cars coming down slick hill close to school entrance
 - Why not keep a secure entrance where it is now?
- Secure entry is a little overboard
- Out of District students-- need to close enrollment to reduce need for expansion-- doesn't seem fair to raise taxes because of OD students
- CrossHarbor send kids to Big Sky rather than have them attend GGS?
- Maybe CrossHarbor would give the district acreage for a new school?
- Wait a year to get through COVID before doing a school bond election
- Is there an increase in operating costs associated with a larger school such as more teachers, utilities, etc? How will that be funded?
