The committee held a workshop where the following topics were discussed with the community members present:

- Welcome, brief introductions, orientation, and guiding principles overview
- Basic needs/ deficiencies
- Overview of two concepts- 1914 building- restore/replace
- Bond information and estimated tax impact
- Community survey link- mailed, emailed, posted to district website and social media on November 6

The building committee received the following feedback/questions from the workshop:

- Explore idea to of making admin/lobby area able to do 2nd story after remodel-- good compromise to keep 1914 building
- How will the district handle additional storage needs without a basement if the 1914 is rebuilt?
- The current basement of the 1914 building is not an ideal place from a security, safety and general environment perspective. How will we deal with continued moisture?
- 2nd story over the 1966 addition (k-2) wing?
- Increasing natural light throughout the building. Both concepts focus on the inclusion of light bringing the outdoors in and the indoors out.
- Ensure community knows that both concepts provide for enough classroom space for current enrollment
- Regardless of which concept is chosen, we must remember that a school is much more than the bricks and mortar. A school building embodies its kids, its education, its heritage.
